

Dr Sandra Iman Pertek is a [SEREDA](#) Research Fellow at the University of Birmingham and gender specialist with expertise in faith and gender-based violence (GBV) with over a decade's experience in humanitarian, development and migration settings. Her research integrates an intersectional and ecological analysis. She is a mixed-methods researcher and an active contributor to networks dedicated to gender/GBV, faith and forced migration. She has led a number of studies across the Middle East and Africa regions; most recently the "[Ukrainian refugees at risk](#)" project in Poland and Ukraine and the [Untold Migrant Stories](#) project at the Mediterranean. She has consulted on behalf of governmental, inter-governmental and non-governmental organisations, including for Home Office, GIZ Islamic Development Bank, on integration of gender, GBV and faith sensitivity into policy and programmes. Previously she served as Senior Policy Adviser on Gender in a leading humanitarian agency, spearheading its gender mainstreaming strategy, and piloted GBV programmes and learning exchange in partnership with institutional donors, including UN agencies and EU. She has recently coordinated several multi-stakeholder initiatives to strengthen protection from GBV in forced displacement, including a SEREDA Roundtable process in Geneva.
